Venue - From Delhi to Pune

The 3rd Youth Games were originally slated to be held in capital city of Delhi as part of the bid put forward by Delhi 2010 to host the Commonwealth Games.

In March 2006 the Organising Committee proposed to move the venue to the city Pune, as the sports facilities in Delhi would be in a state of renovation / construction for the Delhi 2010 Commonwealth Games.



PUNE – The Sports City of the Youth

- Pune is one of the fastest growing cities in India
- With 67 colleges and 3 Universities, over one-third of its 3 million population are youth
- A sports complex built for the 1994 National Games within one site
- A successful history of hosting international events.



PUNE – Ready & Extensive Sport Infrastructure

- **The Chhatrapati Shivaji Sports Complex :**

A single venue for 6 of the 9 sports including the Opening and the Closing Ceremonies.

It also has accommodation for Athletes.



CHATTRAPATI SHIVAJI SPORTS COMPLEX

All Within The Same Complex :

- Athletics Stadium : Seating capacity of 25,000, 400m synthetic track with floodlight facility, press and media rooms, conference hall, VIP lounge and medical bay.
- Indoor Halls :

Badminton	5,000 capacity
Boxing	4,000 capacity
Boxing	2,000 capacity



CHATTRAPATI SHIVAJI SPORTS COMPLEX

All Within The Same Complex :

- Tennis Courts : A dedicated Centre Court with a capacity of 2,000 and several other courts for the preliminaries
- Shooting Ranges : New facilities are being created within the Complex
